


#### Population Aged 65 and Over: 1900 to 2050



### Financial Abuse





- Financial abuse is the largest growing and the most under reported form of abuse.
- Seniors are particularly vulnerable to scams and cons
- According to the National Center on Elder Abuse, 11% percent of ALL elder abuse cases occur in California.

# Annual financial loss by victims of elder financial exploitation

- \$2.9 billion in 2009
- 12% increase from 2008

#### Many studies show:

 Only 1 in 14 cases of elder abuse is reported to authorities.

A more recent study indicates an even larger problem:

 For every case known to programs and agencies, 24 are unknown.\*

#### **Employment**

#### **Warning Signs:**

- Offers to work from home
- Opportunity to make GREAT money
- No application or experience necessary
- You only have to pay a fee for the training materials to get started

#### Internet/Phone/Mail/In Person Scams **Employment**

#### **WHY IT WORKS:**

- Concern about outliving your money
- Websites, emails, and training materials all look legitimate

#### PROTECT YOURSELF:

- REMEMBER....If something seems too good to be true, it probably is!
- Look for warning signs:
  - Email address does not contain a company name or is a gmail address
  - Grammatical errors on emails or other correspondence
- It is not common pay a fee to secure a job....DON'T PAY!

### Internet/Phone/Mail/In Person Scams Romance Scam

#### **Warning Signs:**

- Scammer befriends an individual followed by constant (internet/phone/in person)
- Scammer convinces the individual that they are in love
- Later needs to borrow money for an 'emergency', then another, and another, and another....
- May ask that you cash a check for them and keep some money for yourself
- May push for marriage for legal rights to money and property to quiet objections from family

#### **WHY IT WORKS:**


- ISOLATION
- LONLINESS

#### PROTECT YOURSELF:

- If you are asked to make a loan, do so in person rather than electronic means (wire, prepaid gift/store cards)
- If you are repeatedly asked to make loans to the same person, involve family members or a trusted friend or advisor for a "second opinion"

## Internet/Phone/Mail/In Person Scams Grandparent/Family/Friend Emergency

#### **Warning Signs:**

- Call comes in late at night/early morning
- Caller identifies themselves as a "grandchild", other relative or friend
- Claims to be in trouble; need you to wire money immediately to help them:
  - get out of jail
  - buy a plane ticket to get home
  - pay off a debt to avoid harm or jail time



#### Internet/Phone/In Person Scams

#### **Grandparent/Family/Friend Emergency**

#### **WHY IT WORKS:**

- · You are woken from sleep or caught off guard
- Fight or Flight Reaction
- You fail to confirm the caller's story before acting

#### PROTECT YOURSELF:

- Hang up and call your grandchild or other family members/friends to verify the need for help
- If you believe your grandchild/other relative or friend really is in trouble, contact the police or an attorney for advice

### Sweepstakes/Lottery/Prizes/ Unexpected Winnings



\$120 Million Dollars/Year

#### Internet/Phone/Mail/In Person Scams Sweepstakes/Lottery/Prizes/ Unexpected Winnings

#### **Warning Signs:**

- Offers to purchase foreign lottery tickets
- Offers to collect your "winnings" for lotteries or sweepstakes you did not enter
- Request for credit card information or that you purchase tickets or pay fee for "winnings" by wire or prepaid cards
- Request bank account information so they can electronically deposit your winnings



#### Internet/Phone/Mail/In Person Scams Sweepstakes/Lottery/Prizes/ Unexpected Winnings

#### WHY IT WORKS:

- Gambling is both fun and a bit dangerous
- Potential to "get rich quick" and increase nest egg may be enticing to those on a fixed income

#### PROTECT YOURSELF:

- Never send money or give credit card or bank account details to anyone you don't KNOW.
- Up-front fees for winnings are uncommon...DON'T PAY!
- Never send payment via money order, wire transfer, preloaded card or electronic currency.....

It is rare to recover money sent this way!



### IRS Imposter Scam





#### **IRS** Imposter

#### **Warning Signs:**

- CALL FROM IRS advising you owe money for a tax debt
- Debt MUST be paid immediately at risk of:
  - arrest
  - deportation
  - suspension of driver's license



## Internet/Phone/Mail Scams IRS Imposter

#### WHY IT WORKS:

- Very sophisticated scam:
  - Bogus Caller ID supports authenticity of call
    - Looks like IRS, DMV, or police are calling
  - Background noise to mimic a call center
  - Scammer makes subsequent calls posing as someone from "police" or "DMV"
  - May know last 4 of a person's SSN

#### PROTECT YOURSELF:

- Remember....the IRS will not call you!
- If you believe you have a tax debt, hang up and call known IRS number
- Ask the caller to send a notice in writing

## Internet/Phone/Mail Scams Jury Duty Scam

#### **WARNING SIGNS:**

- CALL FROM COURT advising you missed jury duty
- Request information to "clear things up":
  - birth date
  - Social Security number
  - credit card number to pay assessed fees
- Threats of additional fines or arrest if fees are not paid IMMEDIATELY



#### **Jury Duty Scam**

#### WHY IT WORKS:

- Phone call appears to be coming from a legitimate court
- Scammer is persistent and makes numerous "follow up" calls to further legitimize the issue

#### PROTECT YOURSELF:

- Remember....the courts will not call you!
- Hang up and call known number for courts or dedicated jury duty lines
- Ask the caller to send a notice in writing



#### **Medicare Fraud**

#### **New MediCare Card Update:**



#### **New Medicare Number**

- New Non-Intelligent Unique Identifier
- 11 bytes
- Key positions 2, 5, 8 & 9 will always be alphabetic



#### **Medicare Fraud**

#### **New MediCare Care Update:**

- Medicare starts mailing new cards in April 2018
  - Newly-eligible beneficiaries will get a new card
  - Existing beneficiaries will get a new card over a 12 month period
  - All new cards will include a letter of instruction
- All existing cards will be replaced by April 2019 statutory deadline
- Old cards can be used ONLY through December 2019



## Internet/Phone/Mail Scams Medicare Fraud PROTECT YOURSELF:

- Remember....Medicare will not call you!
- UNTIL YOU RECEIVE YOUR NEW MEDICARE CARD IN 2018:
  - Treat your Medicare Card as you do your credit cards
  - Don't give your Medicare card number to anyone except your KNOWN health care providers
